Lines of Trees, Not Cars

Sign the petition to change Parkallen parking permits, and get your neighbours to sign

Just before 8 a.m. every weekday morning, I bundle my 2-year-old daughter into the vehicle and whisk her to the day home. It takes me only 20 minutes but, by the time I return, my street is flooded with vehicles. Why can't I find a parking spot near my own house?!

Sound familiar? Like you, I am fed up with our streets being turned into parking lots.

With this in mind, I am organizing a petition to expand Edmonton's Restricted Residential Parking Program into the west side of Parkallen. The program would effectively eliminate all-day parking by non-residents.

The program would issue permits for all residents, have visitor

permits available, and a 2-hour parking limit.

Signatures are already being collected.

Where will parking restrictions be put in place?

Restrictions are currently being recommended for 112A Street, 67 Avenue and 70 Avenue between 113 Street and 112 Street, and 62 Avenue between 112A Street and 111 Street. There is potential to expand this permit to other streets, like 112 St. Please get in touch if you are interested in expanding this initiative.

How many signatures are required?

Only one person (over 18 years old) from your household needs

to sign. The signature does not need to be the owner of the house. Signatures are required from two-thirds of households in the affected area.

Sounds great. How do I sign?

Download the petition at tinyurl.com/ParkallenPetition to print and sign yours, and call Niall at (587) 596-5494 for collection.

Each sheet can hold multiple signatures, so share the petition with your neighbours.

When will restrictions be put in place?

Once signatures are received it will take at least 4 months to put up the proper signs and begin enforcement.

Civics Committee Update

When should you call 311?

Do you have a concern the City should know about? Take the time to report it by calling 311, emailing 311@edmonton.ca, contacting 311 Online Edmonton: https://www.edmonton.ca/ programs services/311-cityservices.aspx or downloading the Edmonton 311 App. Ask the 311 representative to email the reference number to you if further follow up is required. If the issue is of broader community concern you can also email civics@parkallen.ca who will advocate on behalf of the community on urgent issues.

LRT Pedestrian Fatality involving Parkallen resident –

On October 6, 2017 a tragic collision with the LRT at the 113 A Street and 60 Avenue pedestrian crossing resulted in the death of Parkallen resident Luke Jansen. A number of Parkallen residents have expressed concerns about safety at this crossing; students attending Avalon Junior High cross here twice daily.

The Parkallen Community League submitted a letter to Mayor Iveson, Councilor Walters and City Operations outlining numerous safety issues at the crossing. A meeting was subsequently held at the crossing with City Transit and Operations managers to review community concerns. We encourage other Parkallen residents who use this pedestrian crossing to contact 311 if you have any observations or incidents to share from your own experience - it's not too late to do this now. The City tracks data collected from 311, and uses these statistics

to prioritize follow up and action. There is strength in numbers, the more calls 311 received, the greater the priority and faster concerns will be addressed.

Drainage Advisory Update -

The Parkallen Drainage Advisory Team has resumed public engagement, now with Epcor, regarding the design of a dry pond and other flood mitigation strategies. The most likely location for the dry pond will be in the NE corner of the central green space east of the school to 111 Street from 68 Avenue to the playground. Parkallen was scheduled for flood mitigation partly based on 311 calls the City has received during past catastrophic rain and flood events, indicating our community was at risk of flooding in the future making flood mitigation a high priority.

Infill News

Notification to Neighbors of Infill

In 2016 and 2017 EFCL (Edmonton Federation of Communities) and representatives from Parkallen and other mature neighborhoods, lobbied the City of Edmonton to provide Notification Class A infill development permits to adjacent neighbours as well as the neighbour behind an approved infill development. This is now required in addition to notification of Class B Development Permits that require a variance.

Neighbours of Infill will now receive a letter and a Neighbours



of Infill Brochure, which includes a link to the Neighbours of Infill Checklist. This checklist recommends neighbours of infill to thoroughly document the preexisting condition of their home & property with photographs and have this inventory notarized prior to demolition and construction of new infill development.

Consider documenting the current state of your property. You may wish to take photos of your yard, house exterior and fence.



Look into options to assess your foundation and to document its current condition, if you have concerns about the effects of excavation or vibration.



Consider obtaining a **Real Property Report (RPR)**. An RPR is a legal drawing that clearly indicates the location of physical features such as: the house footprint, driveway and fences relative to property lines. An RPR is prepared by any Alberta Land Surveyor under the Alberta Land Surveyors Association. **alsa.ab.ca**



Review the City's lot grading guidelines, edmonton.ca/residential_neighbourhoods/ lot_grading/infill-housing-development.aspx



Book a free flood prevention home check-up by a City drainage specialist. edmonton.ca/floodprevention



Review the City's public tree protection guidelines. edmonton.ca/treeprotection



Reach out to the builder (listed on the City of Edmonton notice letter or official permit sign) to establish an open dialogue from the start of the project. The builder can answer questions about:

- ☐ Site plan and design
- Project timelines, including major milestones like demolition and excavation
- Lot grading plan, both during and after construction
- Construction impacts, including noise, dirt and vibration
- ☐ Plans for tree preservation on the lot
- Plans for tree protection on public property





Parkallen's Canada 150 Community Rink Mural

There's an age old saying: "When life hands you lemons, make lemonade."

Parkallen did just that, turning graffiti tagging vandalism into an opportunity for a vibrant, community designed mural.

During 2 days in late July, Parkallen residents from 2 to 81 years old attended mural design workshops. Helmed by Theodora Harasymiw, Parkallen residents created drawings of what makes Parkallen a special place to live. Over 2 weeks, 18 panels totaling 50 square metres - were painted by Kaylyn Hardstaff and Theordora Harasymiw. Highlights include: a bird's eye view of Parkallen, streets lined with trees and colourful homes, year-round play in our park, local businesses, free libraries, our community garden, the monkey tree, a block

party, visiting wildlife and, yes, even a horse!

The City of Edmonton's Capital City Clean Up grant helped cover some of the cost for paint and materials as well as the application of an anti-graffiti and UV protection coat to ensure the mural remains a colourful addition to our park for years to come. First-year students from the University of Alberta's Base Camp program, with the help of community volunteers, helped install the mural which was unveiled September 9, 2017 by Parkallen children attending our Canada 150 Parkallen Country Fair Celebration.
